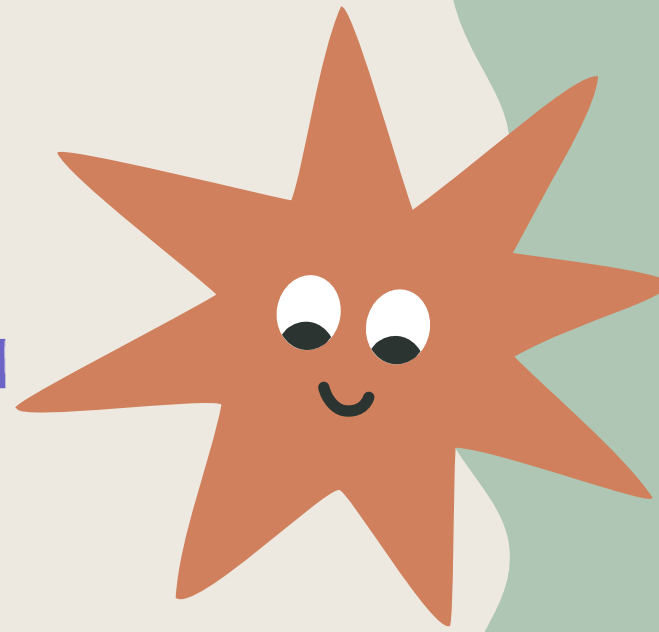
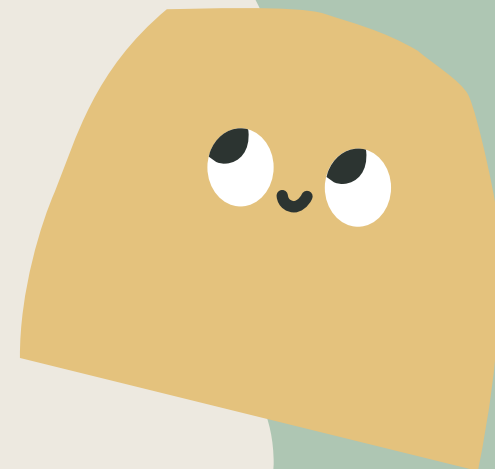


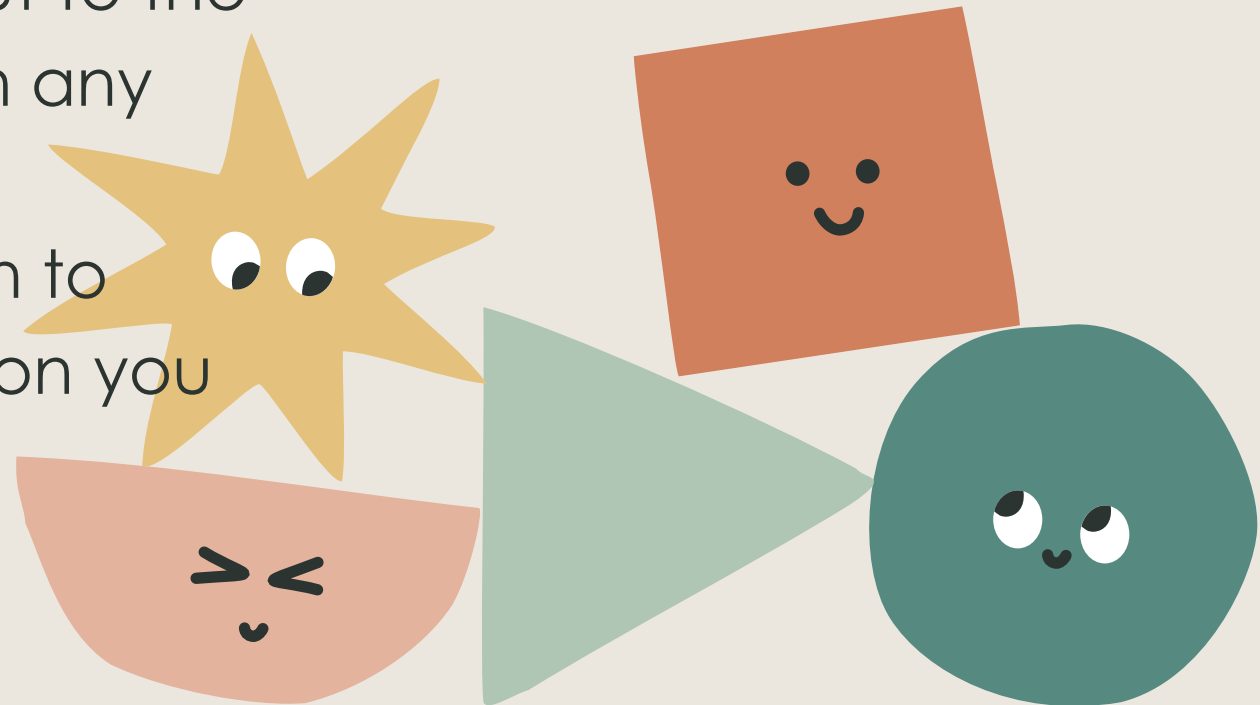


Summer Enrichment Orientation



Welcome to Lilliput Summer Enrichment

- Fun and learning are the goals this summer
- Please don't hesitate to reach out to the office or your child's teacher with any questions or concerns!
- Please read this whole orientation to ensure you have all the information you need to optimize fun!



ProCare Connect: Parent Engagement App

- To maintain good parent teacher communication, we have implemented ProCare Connect, a photo and communication app.
- If you are not already registered, you will receive an email invite on the first day of your child's 1st week of summer enrichment.
- Each Friday teachers will share photos and videos of activities from that week.
- Use the message tab to ask questions or communicate with your child's teacher or the office.
- Current users will rollover into a summer enrichment class on the app

How do I get the app?

- You'll get an email with all the instructions including a unique 4-digit pin and information to download the mobile app via email. One pin per email address. Each parent will need a separate pin.
- Parents will only have access to this app while their child is actively enrolled at Lilliput.

Arrival & Dismissal

- Our summer program runs from 8:30-11:30
- Drop Off: **8:30-8:40** Pick Up: **11:20-11:30**
- Each class has their own designated drop off/pick up location as follows:
 - **Toddlers:** Front porch
 - **Preschool:** Purple door

We do not have an extended day program during the summer.

*Please note there is a \$1 charge per min late fee for pick ups after 11:30

**The fee increases to \$5 per minute after your third late pick up.



Authorized Pick-Up Persons

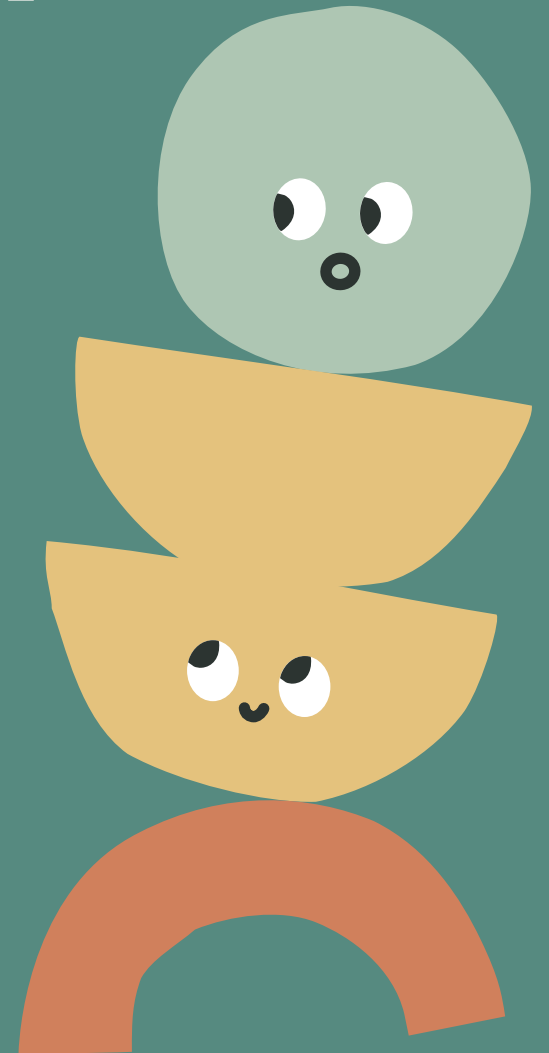
- Only individuals listed in ProCare as authorized pick-up persons are allowed to pick up your child.
- Don't forget to send the office a note if someone **new** will be picking up your child (in writing with the persons full name and phone number).
- Please remind the individual to bring an ID with them

Call Out Absent: If your child will miss school don't forget to let us know one of three ways:

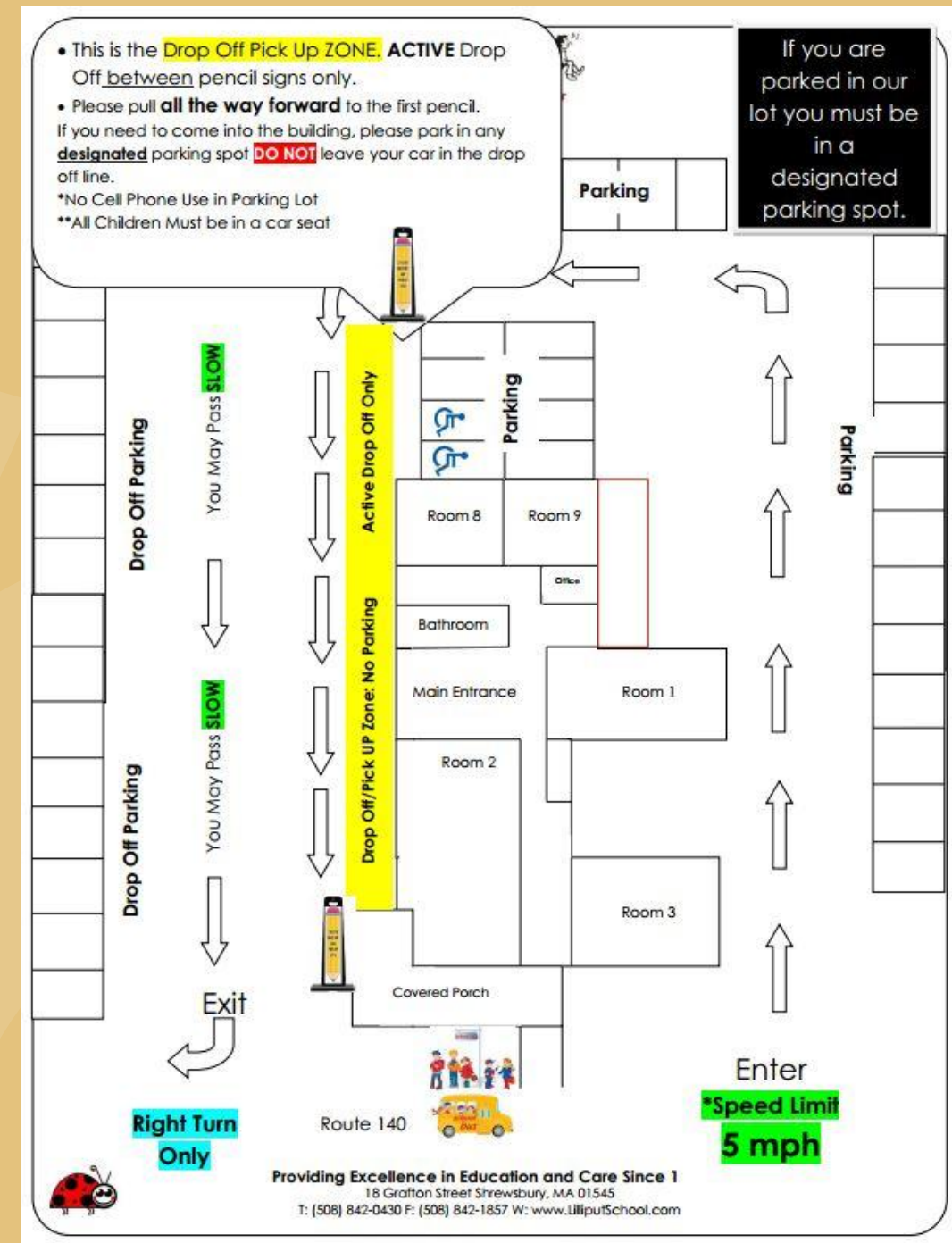

- Please note there are no refunds for summer enrichment this includes for missed days due to illness, injury or vacation days.



Late Arrival to School

- If you are late, please park your car in a parking spot and bring your child to the **PURPLE** door and ring the bell. Someone from the office will let you in.
 - Parents can then escort their child to class.
 - We strongly encourage notes to be pinned to the outside of children's backpacks to increase visibility.
 - If parents would like to have a discussion with their child's teacher, they are welcome to schedule a time with their teacher via email or ProCare messenger.

- Please Drive **Slowly** (5 MPH)
- ACTIVE drop off starts at the Yellow Pencil
- You May Pass, but SLOWLY.
- Pedestrians have the right of way
- Remember:
- Children should be buckled and in the appropriate car seat in accordance with Massachusetts state law for pick up and drop off
- **No Cell Phone** use in the lot or during drop off

*Teachers are encouraged to take advantage of teachable moments and schedules may vary.

Backpacks: All children should have a full-sized backpack so projects and all items listed can fit inside.

Clothes:

- Please send a full change of clothes every day in the event of an accident or if an art or water play project gets too messy.
- Clothes should be in a zipped bag and include a top, bottom, underwear and socks. Please label everything
- Please dress your child in play clothes. Expensive clothing or jewelry should stay at home.

Summer Items:

- Socks and **Sneakers:** No flip flops/sandals/open toe shoes
- Hat/Visor: Optional
- **Sun Block:** Please apply sunblock to your child before drop off

Food/Snacks/Water Bottle:

- All students should come to school with a labeled snack and full water bottle.
- Snacks should be **Nut Free**

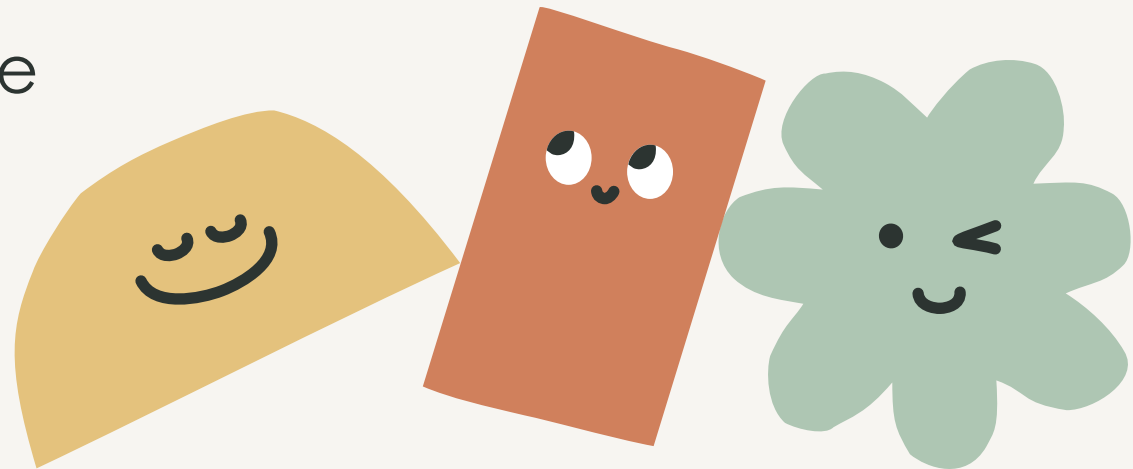
Water Bottle Guidelines

- Send a full water bottle daily: water only please
- Label your child's water bottle
- The container must have a closable spout
- Teachers will re-fill the water bottle when empty with the schools' filtered water.
- Children will have access to their water bottles all day at the class water station
- Please do not send other liquids in their water bottle, for example MiraLAX or milk.
- Milk or juice may be sent in as part of their snack

Label Everything Please!

Snack Guidelines

- All snacks should be in a labeled container with your child's name
- **During Summer We Are Nut FREE.**
- If you send in a nut alternative like Wow Butter or Soy Butter or anything that looks like peanut butter, please label what it is.
- Snacks are not refrigerated. Please use an ice pack as needed.



School Physicals

- All children are required to have an up to date physical to attend summer enrichment.
- Physicals are good for one year from the date of the appointment.
- If your child's physical is expired, and the appointment is scheduled for after the expiration date please send a note including the name/address and phone of your child's doctor and the date for when your child's next physical is scheduled.
- Please note physical forms must include the date of your child's last physical, all immunizations received, lead test results, and clearance to participate in school activities. You can ask your pediatrician for a "School/Camp Physical Form" which should include all of the above.

Wellness Policy

- Lilliput asks parents not to send sick children to school
- If children have any symptoms of illness they should stay home until they are well.
- Each student's wellness is the key to classroom wellness. We ask you to remember that your child's health has the potential to affect other students and their families.

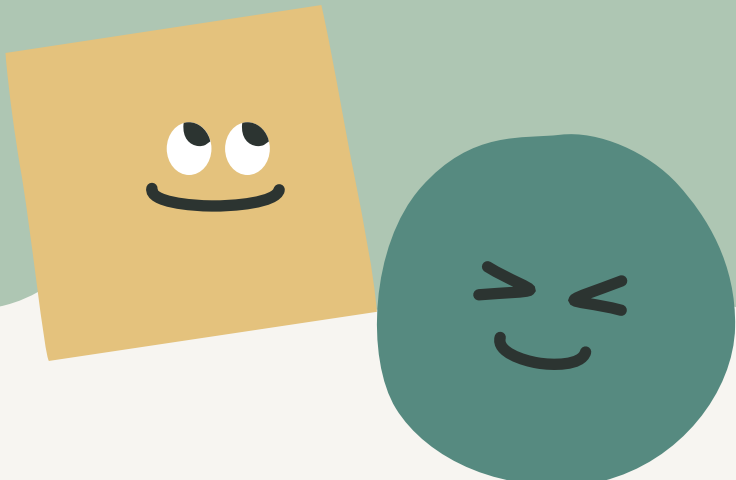

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MEDICATION & ALLERGIES

- If your child requires medication while at school (Inhaler, Epi pen, Benadryl or temporary medication) please contact the office for the required forms.
 - A doctors' order, individualized health care plan, (IHCP) or allergy action plan, and medication consent form are required to be on file
 - Medications need to be in the original container with prescriptions attached if applicable.
- If your child has an allergy or asthma, please be sure to notify your child's teacher and the office before the first day of school.
- Red Bags: each class has a red emergency bag that goes everywhere they do. This bag stores a mini first aid kit, student medication and hand sanitizer. If your child requires medication while at school, it will go everywhere they go.



Sneakers & Sandals

- **Sandals/open toe shoes are not permitted on our playground.**
- Please send your child in sneakers and socks daily
- We want your child to run and jump and play without restriction
- Children who wear sandals or open toe shoes have more foot injuries and move less on the playground due to their restrictive footwear.
- Our playground (preschool and up) uses bark mulch as a fall zone material. It is not fun getting wood chips between your toes or under your feet.



Help Your Child Have A Fun Day At Summer Enrichment!



- Ensure a reasonable bedtime (most children need 12 hours of sleep)
- Arrive to school on time everyday:
 - This will help with the morning drop off transition
 - This will ensure your child does not miss important information for the day presented at morning circle.
- Send a healthy snack and **full** water bottle
- Help your child gain independence and take on responsibility in the morning routine.

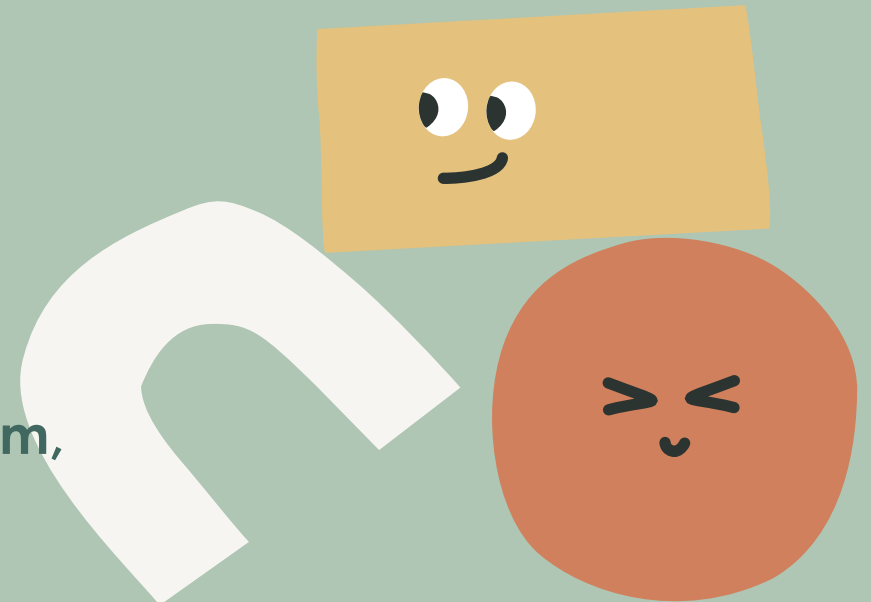
ENCOURAGE INDEPENDENCE

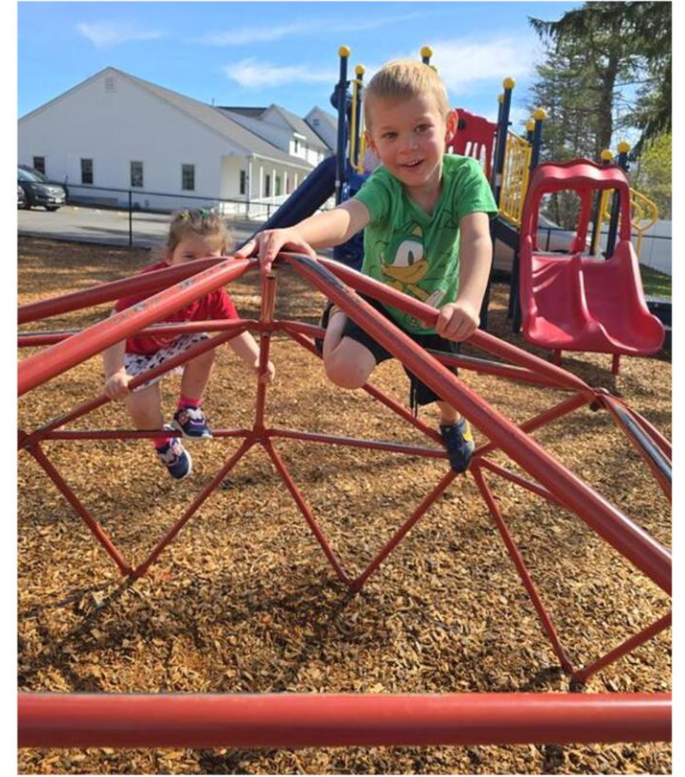
Have your child practice:

- Responding to her/his first and last name.
- Getting dressed and putting on a coat
- Blowing her/his nose and covering a cough/sneeze (elbow please)
- Using the bathroom independently (including wiping and washing hands)
- Eating independently and in a timely manner
- Staying seated while eating at the table without a tablet or TV



Rather than doing tasks for your child start by helping them, then talking them through it.
